
# RAINWATER & MINIMAL WATER GARDEN

- Native Wildflower mix








## SUMMER FRUITS

All the plants were heavily mulched with straw underneath and woodchips on top to retain humidity and reduce water loss.

- Blueberries Perennial, this is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year for the blueberry plants
- Strawberries Perennial, combination of 3<sup>rd</sup> year plants and new starts
- Tomatillos Not the same as the ones in the greenhouse, these self seeded from last year

- Onion flower with seeds
- Garlic Flowers with a honeybee (*Apis mellifera*)
- Black eyed Susan with a honeybee (*Apis mellifera*)
